

Academic Excellence



(Right) High-ability students at St Edward's who are predicted to gain the top grades at GCSE, go on to make outstanding progress. Over the past 4 Years, our high prior attaining students show a significant upward trend in the progress they make during their time with us compared to other high ability children nationally. (2020 - 2021 results are not published due to the COVID pandemic.)

(Left) The National Progress 8 measure shows the progress made by students from the end of their primary school education to the end of Year 11. Over the past 4 years we have seen the school's P8 score rise significantly, and this currently puts us among the top schools nationally.

Curriculum

We are not driven by performance table outcomes, but we are in the top category for examination and other performance indicators nationally. This is a by-product of our approaches, not our aim. Fulfilling our students' potential and helping them to develop as young people ready to go into an ever-changing world with the qualifications, confidence and range of skills, to lead successful and happy lives, is our goal.

Our curriculum preserves creativity, as personal formation is just as important as the acquisition of knowledge. It aims to meet the needs, aptitudes and interests of all of our students and allows them to develop into well rounded, confident young adults. The most important lessons for life aren't just learned in classrooms, and so we offer our programme of enrichment activities including opportunities to represent the school in a wide range of activities.

Key Stage 3

Our Key Stage 3 curriculum secures rapid progress on learning at Key Stage 2 and aims to further develop the skills for essential learning, looking to deepen knowledge and understanding across a broad variety of subject areas. Students follow a broad 3-year curriculum which enables them to sustain academic *and* personal formation through a variety of subjects, with teachers focussed on bringing learning to life.

Key Stage 4

Our Key Stage 4 curriculum provides a broad range of subjects, and KS4 students are able to select a bespoke learning pathway to create a more personalised curriculum based on career or future aspirations. Students have the opportunity to follow a range of courses including Creative Arts, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths), Arts and Sports courses to name but a few. Our EDGE programme runs alongside throughout Key Stages 3 to 5 for highly able and aspirational students.

Key Stage 5

We have an exciting KS5 Curriculum which builds on the skills and knowledge of KS4. Students are able to select from a wide suite of A Levels and Vocational courses which open doors to the next stages of their learning journey.

A high proportion of our students go on to study at Oxbridge and Russell Group Universities, move onto their chosen career or take up apprenticeships. As well as the academic curriculum, students have the opportunity to take part in a range of enrichment opportunities including the Extended Project Qualification, programmes of philosophical enquiry, and sporting pursuits.



Our greatest assets are our teachers and students who work together to bring learning to life.

We are very proud of the quality of our facilities. Our science laboratories give students the opportunity for extensive practical work. Our spacious Arts studios encourages students to work in a variety of media. High quality productions in music, dance and drama are enhanced by the excellent creative arts studios.

ICT facilities are located throughout the campus with computer suites situated at different points around the school. As well as the well-maintained outdoor recreational and sports areas, we have a large sports hall, and newly equipped Fitness suite and Dance studios. However, it's not just the facilities that bring learning to life, but the teachers and students who teach and learn in them. It is they who are the greatest asset of our school.



Virtues

We believe in the formation of the whole person. Our rewards and recognition systems focus on the development of character. Our school virtues were developed with students, and both encourage and form positive behaviours for learning. Extra curricular activities for highly able and aspirational students.

The EDGE Programme is designed and tailored to meet the needs of highly able, and highly aspirational students. It is open to any student who seeks such broader and deeper academic and personal development, from the moment they arrive in Year 7 until the time they leave us in Year 13.



Combining wider extra-curricular opportunities, focussed seminars, bespoke careers support including top-university outreach programmes and mentoring by more senior students; we bring the best of St Edward's and beyond to enhance their educational journey.
