Revision	For a given subject, your child can make flash-cards for revision of specific topics; and then test themselves,
Flipped learning	For a given subject, a student can research new information, or read more widely around current learning. This could be a character study in English, a geographical feature, an historical period etc. They can then write-up this learning, and share it with their teacher when they return.
Memorisation	Create ways of remembering key facts. Mnemonics can be useful. Also visit https://memoreeskils.wordpress.com for techniques to use the brain more effectively.
Improve work	Rework past work in exercise books in order to improve it. Ensure that all corrections have been made.
Create a study schedule	Review learning habits, for example how home-learning is organised. Draw up a home-learning schedule to ensure that high quality work is produced on time, every time.
Reflect	Write an essay about what caused this exclusion, and how you would do things differently next time. Develop this to imagine yourself aged 30. What will you be doing, and why? How will people describe you, and why? What are the steps between where you are now and where you need to be?
